1332 BC—The 10 year reign of Tutankhamun starts
196 BC—The Rosetta stone was carved—holds the key to understanding Egyptian hieroglyphs
51 BC—The reign of Cleopatra begins and the Egyptian civilisation ends.

	River Nile	The river also provided mud for bricks and pots. It gave an opportunity for fishing and a method of transport.	
	Mummifi- cation	The process of preserving a body was important to he Egyptians as they believed this would prepare the body for the journey to the afterlife.	
	Pyramids	These were built as tombs and bodies of important people such as pharaohs were put in them.	
	Tutankha- mun	He was known as the boy king as he started his reign at the age of 9 and died at the age of 18.	
	Howard Carter	He was the English archaeologist who found the tomb of Tutankhamun in the Valley of the Kings in 1922. The discovery was said to be an accident with Carter's water boy stumbling across some steps leading below the desert surface.	
	Religion	This was important to the Egyptians. They believed different gods and goddesses were in charge of different parts of their lives.
